

The Health and Kinesiology Department at The University of Texas at San Antonio invites applications for an Assistant (tenure-track)/Associate Professor (tenure track or with tenure) in Health Promotion. The University is situated in a vibrant and growing community, serving a diverse, multicultural population that is reflected in our student population. While continuing its tradition of excellence in teaching and community services, UTSA is rapidly moving toward classification as a doctoral/research intensive institution.

Responsibilities include teaching both undergraduate and graduate courses in community/public health education and health promotion, conducting nationally visible research in identified specialty area(s) in collaboration with current faculty, pursuing external funding, and performing university and community related service.

Required qualifications: 1) an earned doctorate in Community Health, Health Promotion/Education, Public Health, or related field (ABD will be considered), 2) demonstration of ability to teach in the areas of Community Health, Public Health, Health Promotion/Education or related courses, and 3) demonstration of a solid research agenda and capability; and 4) potential for obtaining external research funding.

Preferred qualifications for Assistant Professor include 1) experience with education of culturally diverse populations; 2) experience teaching public/community health; 3) experience with undergraduate student mentoring; 3) evidence of securing funding for research; 4) ability to conduct collaborative research with existing faculty; and 5) CHES certified.

Additional required qualifications for Associate Professor: In addition to those listed for the assistant professors, associate professors must also present evidence of: 1) a record of externally funded research; and 2) experience in undergraduate and /or graduate student mentoring and supervision in community health and health promotion.

Additional preferred qualifications for Associate Professor include 1) excellence in undergraduate and/or graduate teaching and program development; 2) primary research focus in community health and/or lifestyle intervention; and 3) experience in conducting collaborative research with community and medical groups, and governmental agencies.

All applicants must submit by mail 1) a letter of application; 2) a current curriculum vitae; 3) unofficial transcript for terminal degree; 4) names, phone numbers and e-mail addresses of three professional references; 5) one-page description of research agenda. Applicants are encouraged to submit one or two representative research publications although this is not required. The committee may solicit additional references or other supporting materials. The committee will begin reviewing applications immediately and continue until filled. Salary is

competitive and commensurate with experience and background. Summer employment is contingent on student demand and funding. This position will begin in the Fall 2008, pending budget approval. Applicants who are selected for interviews must be able to show proof that they are eligible and qualified to work in the United States.
